

Confirmation Banners

Confirmation banners are a visual representation of the role of your faith in your life. These banners are to be a personal statement of the commitment that you are making to God. There can be symbols words pictures on the banner to get across the point you would like to make. You will be presenting/explaining your banner to the congregation on confirmation Sunday. The explanation should be no longer than about 30 seconds. You may want to make a little note card to remind you what you would like to say.

Purchase a 36 in. by 36 in. piece of fabric (felt has worked great in the past) to make the banner, and affix a dowel to the fabric for rigidity so that it can hang. Finally, tie string on each end of the dowel so that they can be hung around the church. Write your name on the lower right corner of the back of your banner for easy identification.

**Banners are due no later than May 11th.
They may be left on Chris' Desk.**

Hints:

Michael's (or other craft stores) have precut felt letters that are great for banners.

Start early and work often. Banners take longer than you would think. Work with your sponsor and you finish well before the deadline.

If you are not a good sewer, feel free to use a hot glue gun (don't lick the tip of the gun though) or you can use tacky glue.

Each banner is unique (just like you) so make sure it is a statement of *your* faith, not your friend's, sponsor's, parent's, or pet's.
